The **Historic Preservation Office** data includes archaeological sites, historic properties, and historic districts (represented in light orange).

These locations include the following:

- sites with archaeological value
- properties with buildings, sites, structures or objects deemed historically significant
- districts possessing a significant concentration, linkage or continuity of buildings, sites, structures, or objects united historically or aesthetically by plan or physical development.

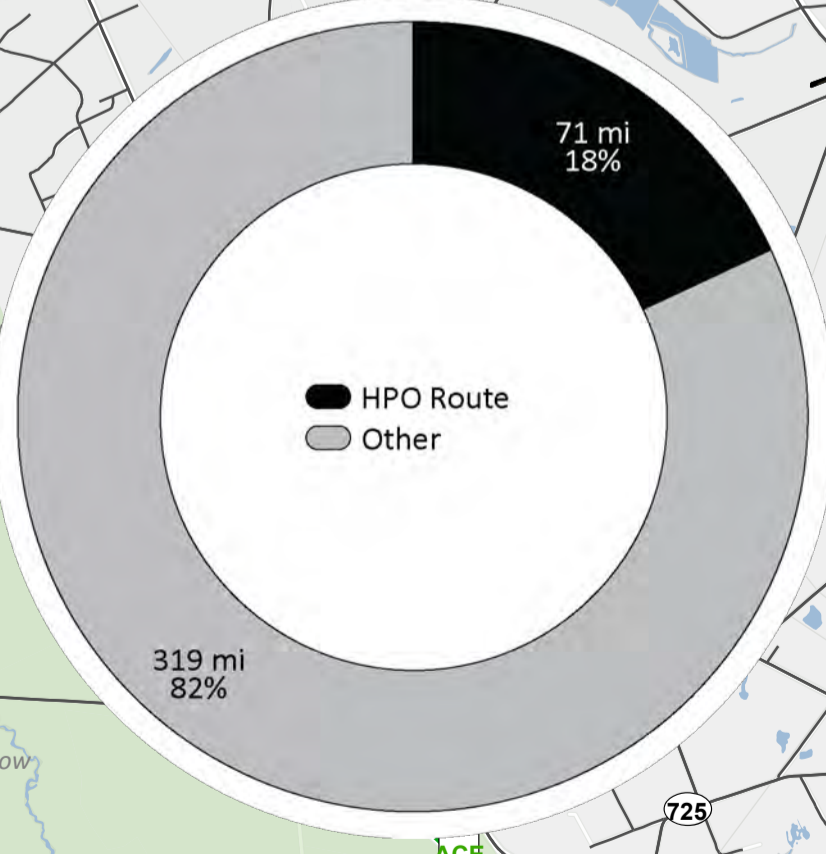


It should be noted there may be other sites, properties or districts that have not yet been identified, documented or digitized.

All motorized vehicles operated on lands under the jurisdiction of the State Park Service are subject to motor vehicle laws of the State of New Jersey, N.J.S.A. 39:1-1, et seq.
The maximum speed limit on all Forest routes is 20 miles per hour, unless otherwise posted.
