



Witness the Progress of the Solar Eclipse August 21, 2017 1-4PM

The New Jersey Astronomical Association, located in Voorhees State Park, will be open to the public for the Partial Solar Eclipse from 1 to 4 PM.

Admission and parking will be free of charge, although we gladly accept donations, as we have no other source of external funding.

We will have volunteers on hand to answer your questions about the sun, astronomy, telescopes, and light.

Unprotected viewing of a partial solar eclipse can permanently damage your eyesight. We will be using safe solar filters.

Directions from Spruce Run Recreation Area:

From the entrance of SRRA, turn right onto Van Sickels Road, proceed east to the traffic light and turn right onto Route 31. Continue south on Route 31, for about a ¼ mile and turn left onto Cregar Road. Continue on Cregar Road for about 1 mile, and turn left onto Route 513 North at the church (which keeps you on 513 North). In approximately one mile, look for a small brown sign on the right for the NJAA Observatory. The next left is the Observatory Road entrance to Voorhees State Park. Follow Observatory Road for approximately ¼ mile, whereupon you may expect to encounter volunteers, who will direct you to a parking space.

If using **GPS**, search for **Observatory Road** in all N.J. cities. Then, select the one in **Glen Gardner**.
